Description: The San Diego Convention Center Corporation (“Corporation”) is seeking proposals from qualified Contractors (“Contractor”) for the replacement of existing flooring and related materials. PROCUREMENT REQUIREMENTS

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Section 1 – Instructions & General Conditions

1. **COMMUNICATIONS:** All communications, any modifications, clarifications, amendments, questions, responses, or any other matters related to the Request for Proposal (RFP) must be made only through the Procurement Contact noted on the cover of this RFP, or their designee. A violation of this provision is cause for the Corporation to reject a company's bid. No contact regarding this document with other Corporation employees is permitted and may be grounds for disqualification.
2. **PRE-BID INFORMATION AND QUESTIONS:** Each bid that is timely received will be evaluated on its merit and for completeness of all requested information. In preparing bids, Bidders are advised to rely only upon the contents of this RFP and accompanying documents, and any written clarifications or addenda issued by the Corporation. If a Bidder finds a discrepancy, error, or omission in the RFP package, or requires any written addendum thereto, the Bidder is requested to notify the Procurement Contact noted on the cover of this RFP, so that written clarification may be sent to all prospective Bidders. All questions must be submitted in writing to the Procurement Contact before the Pre-Bid Question Deadline indicated on the front of this document. All answers will be issued in the form of a written addendum.
3. **PRE-BID MEETING:** A pre-bid site walk is mandatory for consideration. Please **e-mail margaret.mccloskey@visitsandiego.com** to confirm attendance and obtain directions for the meeting location.
4. **RFP MODIFICATIONS:** Clarifications, modifications, or amendments may be made to the RFP at any time prior to the Bid Deadline at the discretion of the Corporation. It is the Bidder's responsibility to periodically check the Corporation's website at **<https://visitsandiego.com/work-with-us/vendors/current-opportunities>** until the posted Bid Deadline to obtain any issued addenda.
5. **BID SUBMISSION:** Submit offer on the Bid Form provided. Bidders are required to complete the entire Bid Form and supplements (if applicable).
 - a. Bids must be submitted to the Procurement Department, San Diego Convention Center Corporation, by **e-mail to margaret.mccloskey@visitsandiego.com**, before the date and time indicated as the deadline. It is each Bidder's sole responsibility to ensure the Procurement Department receives the bid prior to the Bid Deadline.
 - b. Submission of a bid establishes a conclusive presumption that the Bidder is thoroughly familiar with the Request for Proposal (RFP) and that the Bidder understands and agrees to abide by each and all of the stipulations and requirements contained therein.
 - c. All costs incurred in the preparation and presentation of the bid is the Bidder's sole responsibility; no pre-bid costs will be reimbursed to any Bidder. All documentation submitted with the bid will become the property of the Corporation.
 - d. Bids must be held firm for a minimum of 90 days.
6. **EXCEPTIONS:** Bidder shall clearly identify any proposed deviations from the Scope of Work in the Request for Proposal. Each exception must be clearly defined and referenced to the proper paragraph in this RFP. The exception shall include, at a minimum, the Bidder's proposed substitute language and opinion as to why the suggested substitution will provide equivalent or better service and performance. If no exceptions are noted in the Bidder's bid, the Corporation will assume complete conformance with this specification and the successful Bidder will be required to perform accordingly. Bids not meeting all requirements may be rejected.
7. **DUPLICATE BIDS:** No more than one (1) bid from any Bidder, including its subsidiaries, affiliated companies, and franchises will be considered by the Corporation. In the event multiple bids are submitted in violation of this provision, the Corporation will have the right to determine which bid will

be considered, or at its sole option, reject all such multiple bids.

- 8. REJECTION:** The Corporation reserves the right to reject any or all bids, or to accept or reject any bid in part, and to waive any minor informality or irregularity in bids received if it is determined by the Director of Procurement and Contracts that the best interest of the Corporation will be served by doing so. A Bidder's failure to provide any additional information requested by the Corporation prior to a contractor selection may result in rejection of the bid. The Corporation may reject any bid from any person, firm, or corporation in arrears or in default to the Corporation on any contract, debt, or other obligation, or if the Bidder is debarred by the Corporation from consideration for a contract award.
- 9.** The Corporation reserves the right to reject all nonconforming, nonresponsive, unbalanced, or conditional Bids. Discrepancies in the multiplication of unit prices and unit prices themselves will be resolved in favor of unit price. Discrepancies between the indicated sum of any column of figures and the correct sum thereof will be resolved in favor of the correct sum.
- 10. PROCUREMENT POLICY:** Procurement for the Corporation will be handled in a manner providing fair opportunity to all businesses. This will be accomplished without abrogation or sacrifice of quality and as determined to be in the best interest of the Corporation.
- 11. NON-DISCRIMINATION:** Corporation will not contract with any person or firm that discriminates against employees or applicants for employment because of any factor not related to job performance. The Bidder must comply with all federal, state, and local laws and policies that prohibit discrimination in employment contracts. The Bidder must include in its subcontracts provisions that prohibit subcontractors from discriminating in their employment practices.
- 12. BIDDER EVALUATION:** The Bid will be awarded to the most responsive, responsible Bidder meeting specifications with the highest evaluation score based upon the following criteria:
 - A. Cost – 50%**
 - B. Comparable Projects (similar size & complexity) – 15%**
 - C. Company Resume – 15%**
 - D. Project Schedule & Methodology – 5%**
 - E. Safety Record – 5%**
 - F. Terms & Conditions and Proposal Completion – 10%**
- 13. CONTRACT AWARD:** The Corporation reserves the right to award by item, group of items, or total bid. The Bidder to whom the award is made will be notified at the earliest possible date. After a final award of the Contract by the Corporation, the Contractor must execute and perform said Contract. If, for any reason, a contract is not executed with the selected Bidder within fourteen (14) days after receipt of Contract, then the Corporation may recommend the award to the next qualified Bidder.
- 14. DISQUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS:** Any one or more of the following causes may be considered for the disqualification of a Bidder as non-responsible and the rejection of the Bid:
 - a. Evidence of collusion among Bidders;
 - b. Lack of competency as revealed by either financial, experience, or safety statements;
 - c. Lack of responsibility as shown by past work;
 - d. Uncompleted work under other contracts which, according in the judgment of the Corporation, might hinder or prevent the prompt completion of additional work if needed.

- 15. DISCUSSIONS:** Discussions may be conducted with responsible Bidders, in order to clarify and assure full understanding of, and conformance to, the solicitation requirements. Discussions may be conducted with Bidders who submit bids determined to be reasonably susceptible of being elected for award, but bids may be accepted without such discussions.
- 16.** Bidders shall be accorded fair and equal treatment with respect to any opportunity for discussions and revisions of bids. Such revisions may be permitted after submission and prior to award for the purpose of obtaining best and final offers. If during discussions there is a need for any substantial clarification of or change in the RFP, the RFP shall be amended to incorporate such clarification or change. The Bidder shall reduce any substantial oral clarification of a bid in writing.
- 17. PREVAILING WAGE COMPLIANCE:** The Contractor shall be fully knowledgeable of and shall comply with the provisions of the Labor Code applicable to the Work, including the general prevailing wage rate requirements, apprenticeship requirements, and requirements for subcontracts as applicable. Corporation public works projects are subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) in accordance with Labor Code Section 1771.4(a)(1). As part of this program, contractors and subcontractors on public works projects are required to be registered with DIR in accordance with Labor Code Section 1725.5.
- 18. COMMITMENT TO USE A SKILLED AND TRAINED WORKFORCE:** Per Public Contract Code Section 2600 et seq., the Bidder shall not be prequalified and/or shortlisted unless the entity provides an enforceable commitment to the Corporation that the Bidder and its subcontractors at every tier will use a skilled and trained workforce to perform all work on the project or contract that falls within an Apprenticeshipable Occupation in the building and construction trades.
- 19.** The Bidder, by submitting its Bid to the Corporation, agrees that if selected, it and its subcontractors at every tier will comply with the requirements of Public Contract Code Section 2602(a) and that the Bidder will provide the Corporation with evidence, on a monthly basis while the project or contract is being performed, that the Bidder and its subcontractors are complying with the requirements of Public Contract Code Section 2602(a).
- 20. SUBCONTRACTORS:** The successful Bidder must identify all subcontractor(s) regardless of the dollar amount or percentage and the services they will provide. The successful Bidder is responsible for all payments and liabilities of all subcontractor(s). Corporation reserves the right to approve or reject any proposed subcontractor. If the Corporation rejects any proposed subcontractor, the successful Bidder shall be responsible to assume the proposed subcontractor's responsibilities. The successful Bidder may propose another subcontractor if it does not jeopardize the effectiveness or efficiency of the contract.
- 21.** Nothing contained in the RFP or in the contract shall create or be construed as creating any contractual relationship between subcontractor and the Corporation. The Contract will not be assignable to any other business entity without the Corporation's approval.
- 22. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS:** At all times during the term of the contract, the Contractor shall maintain, at their sole expense, insurance coverage for the Contractor, its employees, officers, and independent contractors as follows:

San Diego Convention Center Corporation, Inc., City of San Diego, San Diego Unified Port District, and the members, officers, directors, agents, and employees of each of these three entities shall be named as additional insured.

- 23. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES:** Work shall commence per Contractor’s proposed schedule, subject to acceptance by Corporation and subsequent award and execution of Contract inclusive of this schedule. If the Work is not completed in accordance with the foregoing, it is understood that the Corporation will suffer damages. It being impractical and infeasible to determine the amount of actual damage, it is agreed that Contractor shall pay to Corporation as fixed and liquidated damages, and not as a penalty, the sum equal to \$1,000 U.S. per day for each calendar day of delay until the Work is completed and accepted.
- 24. DISCLOSURE OF CONTENTS:** All information provided in the bid shall be held in confidence and shall not be revealed or discussed with competitors or the general public, until after award of the contract except as provided by law or court decision.
- 25.** Bidders must make no other distribution of the bids other than authorized by this RFP. A Bidder who shares cost information contained in its bid with other Corporation personnel or competing Bidder’s personnel shall be subject to disqualification.
- 26. PUBLIC DISCLOSURE:** Bids are subject to public disclosure after the deadline for submission in accordance with applicable law.
- 27. CONTRACT COMMENCEMENT:** Commencement of a contract shall not begin prior to all necessary Corporation approvals, including Corporation’s Board of Directors approval where required, and subsequent execution of the Corporation’s Contract. Commencement of a contract without these approvals is solely at the Bidder’s own risk and is likely to result in no payment for services performed or goods received.
- 28. CHANGE ORDERS:** In the event Corporation determines to change the SOW to either delete or add work to be performed by Contractor or the materials to be provided for the SOW, Contractor shall prepare a change order. Corporation shall have the right to approve or disapprove the change order. Change orders submitted by Contractor shall not exceed a markup percentage of Ten Percent (10%).
- 29. COOPERATIVE CONTRACT PRICING:** Corporation qualifies for local government cooperative contract pricing. Contractor shall indicate if cooperative contract pricing is being used under Section 3 – Bid Form: Exclusions and Clarifications.

Section 2 – Scope of Work

1) Introduction:

The San Diego Convention Center Corporation (“Corporation”) is seeking proposals from qualified companies (“Contractor”) for removal and replacement of Corporation’s existing flooring on stairs by West Mezzanine rooms. Contractor shall remove and replace all existing flooring and adhesive on the stairs by the West Mezzanine rooms. Contractor shall install approximately 1,400 square feet of New Norament 920, Color 0749 “Stone Grey” Class A rubber flooring. Contractor shall be responsible for all field measurements and verification of quantities necessary for an accurate proposal and performance of the scope of work. No exchange or compensation will be allowed on accounts of differences. Contractor will be required to manage all aspects of the project, including logistics, personnel, and compliance with prevailing wage laws, while minimizing disruption to ongoing operations within the San Diego Convention Center (“Center”).

This initiative aims to revitalize the appearance and functionality of high-traffic areas within the Center ensuring a welcoming atmosphere for attendees and exhibitors alike. The project will involve the complete removal of the existing flooring and adhesive, followed by the installation of high-quality, durable flooring that meets the aesthetic and performance standards of the facility.

Material Specifications:

Contractor shall furnish and install the following materials:

New Norament 920, Color 0749 “Stone Grey” Class A rubber flooring

Manufacturer recommended adhesive in accordance with Norament 920 Class A rubber flooring

All other materials required to complete the project tasks shall be supplied by Contractor. Contractor shall deliver leftover wall base and related materials (attic stock) to Corporation after completion of installation.

2) Objective:

Contractor shall replace the existing flooring on the stairs by the West mezzanine rooms to enhance both safety and visual appeal. In addition, Contractor will ensure all work is executed efficiently and in accordance with local regulations, fostering a seamless integration of the new flooring into the existing environment.

3) Scope of Work:

Contractor shall remove all existing flooring and adhesive to expose the concrete surface underneath. The concrete shall be cleaned and dried before installation of new flooring in accordance with CRI (The Carpet and Rug Institute) 104 Section 8 – “Substrate Preparation” and ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials) F710 “Standard Practice for Preparing Concrete Floors to Receive Resilient Flooring” to ensure the floors are clean and free of oil, waxy films, glue, paint, adhesives, dust and other substances that will prevent adhesion. Contractor shall ensure that the floors are free of cracks, ridges, depressions, and foreign deposits prior to installation. Contractor shall correct conditions which impair proper installation, including trowel marks, pits dents, protrusions, cracks, or joints. Patching or underlayment compounds must be moisture, mildew, and alkali resistant. Contractor shall take necessary precautions to minimize damage to surrounding surfaces during removal and installation of the flooring. Contractor shall ensure newly installed flooring is free of any cut lines. If any joints or cracks are noted in the concrete slab prior to installation, Contractor shall notify Corporation personnel and apply a moisture impervious crack sealant prior to installation of floor coverings. Any damages caused by Contractor during the removal and installation of the flooring shall be repaired at the Contractor’s expense.

Contractor personnel are to comply with ASTM F1344 “Standard Specification for Rubber Floor Tile”, ASTM F2169 “Standard Specification for Resilient Stair Treads”, and applicable manufacturer specifications and standards for proper installation of the material. Flooring cuts and repeats should be installed according to the manufacturer instructions and in a manner to reduce waste.

4) Documentation and Reporting:

Contractor shall provide Corporation with manufacturer recommendations for long-term maintenance of the newly installed product.

5) Quality Control:

Contractor shall provide their own quality control inspections and Corporation will conduct audits of Contractor’s work on a periodic basis. Contractor shall remedy any quality issues found by Corporation. Quality inspections and audits shall be based on ISO-9000. Contractor must remedy any quality issues with installation found by Corporation.

6) Safety and Compliance:

While onsite, Contractor personnel must wear applicable PPE (personal protective equipment) such as gloves, eye protection, knee pads, and follow guidance/safety practices in accordance with all applicable OSHA and manufacturer regulations and requirements. All visits to the Center must be pre-arranged and coordinated with Corporation’s Project Manager before arriving onsite. Contractor personnel are required to wear a Corporation-issued badge at all times to gain access throughout the building.

7) Meetings:

Contractor shall schedule and attend the following meetings without additional cost to Corporation:

- Preconstruction Conference: review responsibilities, personnel assignments, project schedule, site requirements, safety practices, and other items.
- Project Closeout Meeting: held at the completion of the project to inspect site conditions and installation of carpet in specified areas.

8) Project Management:

A dedicated foreman must be onsite at all times during construction for coordination and oversight purposes. Contractor shall determine the needed labor to meet Corporation’s schedule. A project schedule shall be submitted before construction begins and on a periodic basis as changes occur.

9) Warranty and Support:

Contractor shall provide a one (1) year warranty for workmanship and materials provided by Contractor.

10) Schedule & Hours of Work:

Corporation maintains a high occupancy facility where work must be performed around event activity. As a result, awarded Contractor shall comprehensively fulfill the scope of work, within Corporations working hours (7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Pacific Time, Monday through Friday), during one of the below proposed schedules options.

11) Waste Management and Recycling:

Contractor may utilize Corporation’s onsite dumpsters and recycling bins throughout the duration of the project. Contractor shall make every effort to refrain from disposing the debris into the landfill and recycle items to the maximum extent possible. Waste shall be removed often as necessary to ensure debris and resulting dirt/dust particles are minimized. The construction site shall be kept clean and maintained daily. Recycling and waste bin areas are to be kept neat and clean and clearly marked to avoid contamination of materials. Hazardous wastes shall be separated, stored, and disposed of according to local regulations.

12) Parking and Storage:

Contractor may not store excess materials, tools, equipment, or debris at Corporation's site without prior written authorization from Corporation personnel. Any materials or equipment stored at the San Diego Convention Center is at Contractor's own risk. Loading and unloading of materials at a designated loading dock shall be scheduled with Corporation personnel.

Parking will be available on a first come first serve basis. Contractor vehicles are allowed to park without a fee during the term of the project as directed and approved by Corporation's personnel. However, availability is not always guaranteed. If parking is not available, Contractor will be subject to parking fees.

13) Corporation Equipment:

Contractor shall have the right to use Corporation ladders and scissor lifts during the project, subject to availability. A waiver may be required to be signed prior to use of any Corporation provided equipment.

Contractor acknowledges that this project is a public works project as set forth in Labor Code § 1720, et seq. and certifies that all workers employed in the execution of the contract will be paid the correct prevailing wages. The San Diego Convention Center Corporation has obtained from the Director of the Department of Industrial Relations, general prevailing wage determinations for the locality in which the work is to be performed. Copies of such wages are on file at SDCCC and available for inspection to any interested party upon request. The Contractor shall be responsible for any penalties levied in accordance with Labor Code § 1812 for failing to pay required overtime wages.
